#### WORKSHOPS AND PROGRAM

**9:00 AM. "Black Forest Clocks Prior to 1900." Arnoud Meurs** will give a slide presentation of Black Forest clocks made prior to the industrialization of the German clock Industry. Since 1972, Arnoud has been an avid clock collector specializing in folk art European (Dutch, early Black Forest and Morbier) and Japanese Samurai clocks. In 1985, he became a full time clock dealer as well as selling music boxes and barometers. As the son of an antiques and clock dealer, he has had a long association with clocks. Arnoud is a member of eight chapters in the Northeast, and speaks widely on his specialties.

**10:30 AM.** "Veneering Curved Surfaces." Larry Chelmow, past Chapter 8 President, will give a presentation about techniques for veneering curved surfaces. These techniques include case preparation, veneer matching, cutting and fitting, gluing, methods of clamping, and final finishing of the restored areas. Larry is on the board of three museums: Willard House & Clock Museum, American Clock & Watch Museum, and the Charles River Museum of Industry & Innovation. Also, he is a member of the Collections committee of the NAWCC. Larry routinely carries out a wide range of clock movement and case repairs.

### 12:00 Noon. Luncheon

**12:45 PM, Luncheon Program. "A Clock Gleam in His Eye." Bob Schmitt**, well known to many members of many chapters, will give a talk centering on that first gleam in his eye in 1968 for the irresistible clocks he found at Schmidt's Antiques in Ypsilanti, MI, up through his serious collecting of skeleton clocks, and reviewing his current career as an auctioneer. He grew up in California and graduated from the Andersen School of Business at UCLA in 1968. Bob began his collecting career while working for the Ford Motor Company, owing to the inspiration of his first Supervisor, Gordon Rice. His first auction was in 1979, and in 1980 left Ford to pursue clocks full time.

#### **Directions:**

<u>From the East or West</u>: Mass Turnpike (I-90), take Exit 10, then stay to the right after exiting the toll plaza and to Southbridge St. (Route 12) going south. The Elks Club is about 0.6 mile on the right.

<u>From the North</u>: follow Route 290 to Exit 6, then to Route 20 West. Follow Route 20 to the 4<sup>th</sup> set of lights (Route 12 intersection). Turn right (north) on to Route 12. The Elks Club is about 0.3 mile on the left. Note: the exit for Route 20 West off of Route 290 in the very first exit after the Mass Turnpike. The exit comes up quickly, so be aware of this situation.

<u>From the South</u>: follow Route 395 (becomes Route 290 in Auburn) and take Exit 6 for Route 20 West. Proceed to the 4<sup>th</sup> set of lights (the junction of Routes 12 and 20) and turn right on to Route 12 North. The Elks Club is about 0.3 mile on the left.
