#### **MORNING SESSION**

9:15 am. The Stabilization and Preservation of a Simon Willard Tallcase Clock Movement and Case – Les Tyrala

This Federal Simon Willard tallcase clock has remained in the original eastern Massachusetts family and house from the time of its purchase. The movement has the typical features of an 8-day, T/S movement, and will be discussed. An arched white-painted floral-spandrel moon dial is attached to the movement by a Wilson falseplate. The mahogany, mahogany veneer, and pine case show features typically associated with a Roxbury-style design, that is, ogee feet, lower inlayed, elliptical medallion, brass-stopped fluted columns, pierced fretwork, and spire and ball finials. The base, waist and bonnet all required different degrees of stabilization and restoration using materials and methods consistent with the age of the piece. Where there were complex stabilization and/or preservation questions, conservators were consulted. Numerous images will be shown as well as a range of tools.

#### 11:00 am. Gold Leaf Restoration – Nancy Dick Atkinson

This presentation, in the form of a demonstration of techniques and what materials are required, will concentrate on traditional water gilding, including the preparation of gilder's gesso and clay. The demonstration will include the proper use of gilding tools as well as handling of the gold leaf. Mordant gilding, using both oil and water-based sizes in preparation of applying 22 karat surface gold leaf, will be presented. The subject of toning/matching of the gold will be referenced to an in-depth publication for those who would like to explore the subject further. Please bring your questions.


#### 2:15 pm. **Tour of the Willard Clock Museum**

#### A NOTE ABOUT THE SPEAKERS
