President's Message

ONE-TIME REDUCTION OF \$10 OF THIS MEETING REGISTRATION FEE

Those signing up for this meeting will note a temporary lower registration charge. As a matter of prudence, the chapter has kept a cash reserve over the years to cover possible unforeseen disasters, and to act as a buffer for chapter events whose income comes up short of expenses. The council has recently reexamined the size of this reserve, and decided to trim it back a bit by this one- time reduction of the registration fee by \$10, as a way of returning the excess to the membership.

At this writing (March 16th), the Boston Globe predicts all the snow will be gone by the time of the upcoming meeting, barring a repeat of the April Fools blizzard or the Easter blizzard of a few years back.

Regarding the recent membership survey, results are currently being studied and debated by the council. We had a surprisingly strong response of 130 replies out of 310 mailed surveys

Percentage-wise the greatest number of responses could be grouped by the following categories: reducing the meeting costs, the paucity of Mart dealers, elimination or change of the current sit-down lunches, meeting at other geographic locations, having council meetings at a day and time to allow working members to attend, and the need to increase the membership. Other comments were given and will be reported upon after the complete evaluation of all of the questionnaires.
