MORNING SESSION

Introduction to the Vacuum Press – David Hagberg 9:15 am.

The vacuum press is a fascinating tool, and can be used for creating veneered, as well as curved wooden surfaces, and for repairing damaged veneer. David will demonstrate a vacuum press, explain how it works, discuss ways to apply it to clockcase repair, and give advice to those who might consider acquiring one.

David Hagberg was born into the clock world - His father, the late Kenneth Hagberg, trained with Worcester watchmaker Gus Lahde as a teenager, and later worked for Bradford W. Cheney as well as independently. After learning the craft at his father's knee, David worked for the Cheney family for several years. A schoolteacher now in nearby Westborough, David teaches everybody's favorite class. He's the Wood Shop teacher!

11:00 am Assorted Clock Repair Procedures – John Losch

His program will be a discussion of various clock repair procedures including repair and handling of mainsprings, straightening small bent arbors, filing a square hole, inserting teeth in a barrel, and more as time allows. Questions from the floor will be encouraged, and attendees are welcome to bring their own pieces with repair problems.

John Losch is a semi-retired clockmaker who recently passed his milestone 70th year at the bench. He writes and lectures occasionally, and serves as a trustee of the Willard House and Clock Museum, and as an emeritus trustee of the American Clock and Watch Museum in Bristol, Conn.

AFTERNOON SESSION

1:00 pm. Ethical Considerations in Clockcase and Furniture Conservation – Sean Fisher and Chris Shelton

Every object treatment is different: ultimately each treatment is determined by combining the unique needs of the object and those of the owner. We will discuss the treatment of several different clocks and possibly a few pieces of furniture, focusing on the ethical considerations made for each object. This will include structural repairs, the replacement of missing decorative elements, and finish conservation.



Its two principals, Sean Fisher and Chris Shelton, are leaders in the field. Sean Fisher is a graduate of Boston's North Bennet Street School. He attended the Smithsonian's Conservation Analytical Laboratory program in furniture conservation and worked for the Preservation Society of Newport County, the Museum of Art, Rhode Island School of Design, and the New York State Parks Department. Chris Shelton received his graduate degree in conservation from the University of Delaware/Winterthur Art Conservation Program. He worked for Colonial Williamsburg and for the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston on their modern and European collections as well as for the Bayou Bend Collection of American Art.
