#### WORKSHOPS AND PROGRAMS

**9:30 AM. "Using NAWCC Internet Resources."** Today's talk by **Tom McIntyre** will focus on the currently available tools and communities of fellow horologists who are eager to help you with your thorny clock and watch problems. The NAWCC publications and archives both physical and electronic represent a great resource of data and ideas on clocks, watches and more exotic aspects of collecting, building and repairing clocks and watches. Work is currently under way to make these resources more available to members and the public. Much of the talk will focus on the NAWCC Message Board and its use, but guidance will also be provided for resources on other NAWCC facilities. Tom has been working with computers since 1962 when he used a Lincoln Laboratories Linc computer to learn assembly language programming. In the intervening 56 years, he has had a diverse career in software and digital systems. Since retiring in 2002, essentially all his time has been devoted to providing the NAWCC with computer systems and software to allow horology to remain relevant to future generations.

**10:30 AM.** "Innovative Fine Foreign Watches in the US 1850-1900." This talk by Jon Weber will be a decade by decade overview of foreign watchmakers' development of new watch technologies and concepts to compete in the US market. Some of these models were adapted and copied by US makers such as high grade 12 size watches. The talk reviews general and horological history and shows example watches. Jon has a PhD in solid state physics which led to a career in scientific instrument sales and aerospace engineering. He joined the NAWCC in 1971 and has been an officer in several chapters and has published several articles in the Watch and Clock Bulletin, one in the Swiss Journal, Chronometrophelia, and has an article in work on one of the watches in this talk. He is now retired but works in a watch repair shop and has interests in wrist and pocket watches as well as watchmaking tools.

#### Noon. Lunch

**1:00 PM. "The Modern Public Clock – A Definition."** This presentation by **Brandie Morris and Tom Erb** will be about the history of modern public clocks along with a discussion of the introduction of electric powered clocks and Henry Warren (of Telechron fame) – the "Father of Electric Time." Brandie, Director of Marketing for the Electric Time Company, Medfield, MA. has been involved in this nationally-known clock business since the 1980's. She is a current member and Past President of the Charles River Chapter of Questers International (antique collectors). Tom has been President of Electric Time Company for over 30 years. He has undergraduate and graduate degrees in Electrical Engineering from UMass Amherst and Northeastern University. Since 1988, Tom has been a member of the NAWCC. He collects way too many telechron clocks (which Electric Time grew out of) – including power station master clocks – and a motor generator set which he is still trying to find a place to display.
